Patrick Weigel, male, born in 1971, German citizen, employee representative. Member of the Supervisory Board of the OSRAM Licht AG, current term of office until 2027.

Patrick Weigel has more than 25 years of professional experience in industrial production and manufacturing environments, in particular in the areas of production equipment engineering, automation, control systems and industrial image processing. He has been employed by the OSRAM Group since 1998 and, in his role as Production Equipment Systems Specialist at the Berlin site, is responsible for the procurement, programming, optimization and continuous operation of production and automation systems.

In this function, Mr. Weigel is primarily responsible for optimizing software programs for control and image processing systems. In addition, he provides technical guidance to machine setters and is involved in qualification-based personnel deployment planning within the technical environment. His responsibilities also include the evaluation and implementation of new systems as well as their ongoing development during live production operations. Furthermore, he has sound user-level knowledge of SAP.

In addition to his professional role, Mr. Weigel has long been engaged in employee representation. He serves as Chairman of the Works Council of OSRAM GmbH at the Berlin site and as Deputy Chairman of the Group and Central Works Council of OSRAM GmbH.

Prior to joining OSRAM, Mr. Weigel held various positions in the electronics and automated services industry, including roles as an electronics technician at Playpoint GmbH and MAS Automaten-service. He began his professional career after completing his vocational training as an electronics technician specializing in maintenance at LIW Müncheberg.
